



ASSEMBLER/TESTER II

This is a Temp to Hire position

About the position

As an Assembler/Tester, you will perform assembling, setting of relief point, testing, painting, and preparation for shipment of all SRV valves, MOV chokes, and other valve and choke related products using the facilities provided in the assembly and testing department.

Essential Functions

- Receives instructions and work orders for the job and performs the tasks required.
- Uses hand tools and power tools to assemble units according to production specifications from work order kits.
- Tests and calibrates parts to meet tolerances and product specifications for customer needs based on the work order.
- Identifies units that fail tests or tolerance levels and repairs, as necessary.
- Maintain a safe and orderly environment.
- Clock in and out from job orders to ensure correct labor entries.

Additional Responsibilities

- Maintains a daily test booth gauge log whenever a test booth is used to set a valve.
- Maintains product traceability by applying the serial number to the part.
- Maintains Quality Assurance trace ability by applying their own individual stamp to the part, during the assembly process, the setting process, and testing process.
- The noise level in the environment is loud, hearing and eye protection are mandatory.

Qualifications

- Gains or has attained full proficiency in a specific area of discipline.
- Work involves varying degrees of precision and control where damage could be considerable.
- Attention and care required preventing injury to others when performing maintenance work.
- Work involves considerable stooping, bending, and working in overhead structures. Considerable noise emits from work, requiring the wearing of personal protective equipment. Exposed to possible flying objects, such as high-pressure air and water, metal nuts, bolts, and plugs.
- Accident hazard can involve severe cuts and bruises. Job site must be carefully enclosed to prevent injury to others from noise and flying parts.

Education and/or Experience

- High school diploma or general education degree (GED), preferably; or one to three years of related experience and/or training; or equivalent combination of education and experience. May be required to complete an apprenticeship or on the job training.

Language Skills Ability to read and interpret documents such as safety rules, operating and maintenance instructions, and procedure manuals. Ability to write routine reports and correspondence. Ability to speak effectively before groups of customers or employees of organization.

Mathematical Skills Ability to add, subtract, multiply, and divide in all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions, and decimals. Ability to compute rate, ratio, and percent and to draw and interpret bar graphs.

Reasoning Skills Ability to apply common sense understanding to carry out detailed but uninvolved written or oral instructions. Ability to deal with problems involving a few concrete variables in standardized situations.

Computer Skills To perform this job successfully, an individual should have knowledge of Visual Database software.

Certificates, Licenses, Registrations

Physical Demands While performing the duties of this Job, the employee is regularly required to stand; use hands to finger, handle, or feel and reach with hands and arms. The employee is frequently required to walk; climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl and talk or hear. The employee is occasionally required to sit. The employee must regularly lift and/or move up to 10 pounds, frequently lift and/or move up to 25 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception and ability to adjust focus. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Work Environment While performing the duties of this Job, the employee is regularly exposed to moving mechanical parts. The employee is frequently exposed to vibration. The employee is occasionally exposed to wet and/or humid conditions and outside weather conditions. The noise level in the work environment is usually loud. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Safety-Sensitive Position Safety-Sensitive means any job that includes any tasks or duties that the employer reasonably believes could affect the health and safety of the subject employee or others.
